COURSE TITLE: Certified Nurse Aide Training

COURSE ALPHA: AH **COURSE NUMBER:** 154

CATALOG DESCRIPTION: Prepares students for work as a certified nurse's aide. Course includes academic instruction, hands on practice in a laboratory setting, and clinical instruction in a long term care facility. Upon successful completion of the course, students are eligible to take the certified nurse aide examination in the state of Michigan. Students will be required to meet immunization standards of the clinical facilities and will be subject to a criminal background check prior to being able to participate in clinical instruction.

PREREQUISITES: None Students should be advised that clinical instruction may take place outside of times allotted for normal classroom or lab time.

COREQUISITES: None

GENERAL EDUCATION OUTCOMES: Communicate effectively.

COURSE OBJECTIVES & OUTCOMES: Upon completion of this course, students will have the knowledge to provide quality services to residents in long term care facilities and home health care settings as evidenced by:

1. Ability to form a therapeutic relationship, communicate and interact competently on a one to one basis with residents and clients.

2. ability to demonstrate sensitivity to residents' and clients emotional, social, and mental health needs through skillful, directed interactions
3. ability to assist residents and clients in attaining and maintain functional independence
4. Demonstration of observational, technical, and documentation skills needed in the assessment of residents' and clients' health, physical condition and well-being.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION: Lecture, lab, demonstration, direct patient care experiences, videos

METHODS OF EVALUATION: Tests, quizzes, skills completion examinations, ability to provide competent and safe direct client care under the direction of a clinical instructor.
