CATALOG DESCRIPTION: Designed to expose the EMT-Paramedic candidate to various clinical areas in the hospital and pre-hospital environment for actual patient care and interaction. The clinical areas are selected to provide the student with an opportunity to practice and refine the skills necessary to function effectively in the role of the EMT-Paramedic. Clinical areas this semester will include the emergency department, intensive care unit, obstetrical unit, pediatrics unit, and EMS agencies. Students are required to maintain current immunizations, health insurance, and BLS for the professional rescuer. Additional clinical experiences may be provided as the opportunity permits.
