**A clinical nursing application of theory and concepts focused on family centered care of children in the hospital and in community settings. The nursing process is used to guide development of interventions and strategies for nursing care. Emphasis is on delivery of safe, comprehensive, and holistic care of children and their families in collaboration with members of the health care team and under the guidance of the clinical instructor.**

Supervised care of children in a variety of clinical settings.
